REGULATION UNDER THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT 1905.

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following amended Regulation under the *Wireless Telegraphy Act 1905*, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY REGULATIONS 1913.

(Statutory Rules 1913, No. 351.)

Regulation 17 is *repealed*, and the following Regulation is *inserted* in its stead:—

“ 17. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, the wireless appliances on board any Australian ship, British ship, or foreign ship (other than a ship of war) shall not be worked or used while the ship is moored to any wharf or pier in Australia, or any Territory of the Commonwealth.”
