B<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Supply Act (No. 4) 1915-16.

2. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the #10,245,608. service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and sixteen the sum of Sixteen million two hundred and forty-five thousand six hundred and eight pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

3. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under sum available the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and for the purposes services set forth in the said Schedule.

4. No moneys shall be expended under the authority of this Act Limit of period after the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.
