An Act to appropriate a further sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

Assented to 15th March, 1917.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation Short title. Act 1914-15.
- 2. The sum of Four hundred and fifty-nine thousand seven Appropriation of £459,780. hundred and eighty pounds which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and fifteen shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Act No. 2 of 1914 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act.
