REGULATIONS UNDER THE WHEAT GROWERS RELIEF ACT 1933.

I, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *Wheat Growers Relief Act 1933*.

WHEAT GROWERS RELIEF REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Wheat Growers Relief Regulations*. Short title.

2. All Regulations made under the Act and in force at the commencement of these Regulations are hereby repealed. Repeal.

3.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

“assistance” means assistance provided under the Act;

“the Act” means the *Wheat Growers Relief Act 1933*. Definitions.

(2.) In these Regulations any reference to a Form shall be read as a reference to a Form contained in the Schedule to these Regulations. Definitions.

4. A wheat-grower who desires to claim assistance shall lodge, in duplicate, with the State Authority for the State in which he resides (or with the Secretary, Department of Commerce, Canberra, in the case of wheat-growers resident in any Territory) a declaration in accordance with Form A. Declaration to be furnished by wheat grower on prescribed form.

5. A wheat-grower in a Territory who desires to claim assistance shall forward to the Secretary, Department of Commerce, Canberra, on or before the thirtieth day of June, 1934, in addition to the declaration referred to in the last preceding regulation, a claim for assistance, and a declaration, in accordance with Form B. Claims for assistance by wheat growers in a Territory.

6. All declarations made under or in pursuance of these Regulations shall be made before—

- (a) a Commissioner for Declarations,
- (b) a Justice of the Peace,
- (c) a Bank Manager,
- (d) a Postmaster or officer in charge of a Post Office,

Persons before whom declarations are to be made.

Notified in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 7th June, 1934.

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- (e) a Railway Stationmaster or railway official in charge of a Railway Station or Siding, or
 (f) a Constable or Officer of Police.

Untrue statements in declarations.

7. A person shall not make any false or untrue statement in any declaration made under or in pursuance of these Regulations.

Penalty: Fifty pounds or imprisonment for three months.
