REGULATIONS UNDER THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT 1901-1934.*



AMENDMENT OF THE POSTAL REGULATIONS.†

1. Regulation 7 of the Postal Regulations is amended—

Late fees.

- (a) by omitting from sub-regulation (2.) the words "except parcels,"; and
- (b) by omitting sub-regulation (3.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-regulation:—

"(3.) The late fee on ordinary parcels, registered parcels, cash-on-delivery parcels, or insured parcels, which are posted for any destination at any post office at which 'late fee' parcels are accepted, shall be Twopence for each parcel."

2. Regulation 103 of the Postal Regulations is amended—

Undelivered postal articles generally.

- (a) by inserting at the end of paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (2.) the word "or"; and
- (b) by omitting paragraph (e) of sub-regulation (2.).
