No. 42 of 1940.

An Act to appropriate a further sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

[Assented to 4th June, 1940.]

[Date of commencement, 2nd July, 1940.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Supplementary Appropriation Act* 1938-39. Short title.

2. The sum of One million one hundred and ninety-three thousand one hundred and thirty-one pounds which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the commencement of the *Appropriation Act* 1938-39 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act. Appropriation of £1,193,131.
