## SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION 1939-40.

#### No. 62 of 1941.

An Act to appropriate a further sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty.

[Assented to 3rd December, 1941.]

[Date of commencement, 31st December, 1941.]

E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation short title. Act 1939-40.

2.—(1.) Subject to sub-section (2.) of this section, the sum of Appropriation Two million two hundred and thirty-nine thousand and twenty-nine pounds which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty, shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the commencement of the Appropriation Act 1939-40 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act.

The amounts specified in the Schedule to this Act for the purposes and services of the Department of Defence and which have been issued and applied for the corresponding purposes and services of one or more or all of the Departments established in lieu of that Department shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the commencement of the Appropriation Act 1939-40 for those corresponding purposes and services.
