REGULATIONS UNDER THE NATIONAL SECURITY ACT 1939-1940.*

AMENDMENTS OF NATIONAL SECURITY (DAIRY PRODUCE ACQUISITION) REGULATIONS.†

1. Regulation 8 of the National Security (Dairy Produce Acquisition) Regulations is amended by inserting, after the word "Committee", the words "or of the Executive Committee of the Committee" Fees and expenses.

2. After regulation 8 of the National Security (Dairy Produce Acquisition) Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

"8A.—(1.) There shall be an Executive Committee of the Committee which shall consist of the Chairman of the Committee (who shall also be Chairman of the Executive Committee) and five other members of the Committee appointed by the Minister. Executive Committee.

"(2.) The Committee may delegate to the Executive Committee such of its powers and functions as the Committee, subject to any direction by the Minister, determines:

Provided that no such delegation shall prevent the exercise of any power or function by the Committee."

3. After regulation 15 of the National Security (Dairy Produce Acquisition) Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

"15A. Any person from whom any dairy produce has been acquired by the Commonwealth under these Regulations shall preserve all records and books of account relating to that dairy produce for a period of one year after the date of the acquisition of that dairy produce." Records and books of account to be preserved.
