- 1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (Works and Services) Short title. Act (No. 2) 1949-50.
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it commencement receives the Royal Assent.
- 3. The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His application of Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, the sum of Eleven million pounds.
