COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION REGULATIONS.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Commonwealth Employees' Citation. Compensation Regulations.
- 2. The Employees' Compensation Regulations (comprising Statutory Repeal. Rules 1953, Nos. 22 and 73; Statutory Rules 1954, No. 19; Statutory Rules 1958, No. 40 and Statutory Rules 1960, No. 42) are repealed.
 - 3. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

Definitions.

- "authority" means an authority of the Commonwealth specified in regulation 14 of these Regulations;
- "the Act" means the Commonwealth Employees' Compensation Act 1930-1959.
- 4.—(1.) A claim for compensation under the Act shall be addressed to Claim for the Permanent Head or Chief Officer of the Department or authority in or by which the employee was employed at the time when the injury, incapacity, or death upon which the claim is based occurred and shall be—
 - (a) sent by post in an envelope so addressed on which the postage has been prepaid;

- (b) delivered to the head office of that Department or authority; or
- (c) delivered to the officer in charge of the work on which the employee was so employed.
- (2.) In the application of this regulation in relation to a claim in respect of an employee who is suffering from a disease, or whose death has been caused by a disease, that was due to the nature of his employment in more than one Department or authority, the claim shall be sent or delivered in accordance with paragraph (a) or (b) of the last preceding sub-regulation as if the disease was contracted where he was last so employed.
- (3.) A claim for compensation under the Act by an employee shall be in accordance with Form A in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- (4.) A claim for compensation under the Act by a dependant shall be in accordance with Form B in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- 5. An election made by an employee under section 15 of the Act shall Election under be in accordance with Form C in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- 6. The Commissioner may, from time to time, appoint such medical Appointment of medical boards as are required. hoards.
- 7. The medical practitioner, medical referee, or medical board to whom Medical or to which a matter is referred under section 19 of the Act shall, if so examinations. required by the Commissioner, give a certificate in accordance with Form D in the Schedule to these Regulations and shall forward it to the Commissioner or his delegate as soon as possible after the examination.
- 8. An employee who is required by the Commissioner in pursuance of Time for section 19 of the Act to submit himself for examination by a medical board, employee of may, within seven days of the date on which he is so required, nominate representative on medical a medical practitioner to be one of the members of the board.

- 9. An employee who has made a claim for compensation, or is in Frequency of receipt of weekly payments, under the Act shall not be required after a medical examinations. period of one month has elapsed from the date on which the first payment of compensation was made, to submit himself against his will for examination by a medical referee, a medical board, or a medical practitioner, provided and paid by the Commonwealth, except at reasonable hours and not more frequently than once a week during the second month, once a month during the third, fourth, fifth and sixth months after the date on which the first payment of compensation was made and, thereafter, once in every two months.
- 10.—(1.) An appeal under section 20 of the Act may be instituted by Appeals. notice of appeal in accordance with this regulation.

- (2.) The person appealing shall, within thirty days after service of the notice of the determination or action appealed against, serve the notice of appeal on the Commissioner and shall file a copy of the notice of appeal in the County Court.
 - (3.) The notice of appeal shall state the grounds of appeal.
- (4.) A person who intends to apply to the Court for extension of the time for appeal shall serve on the Commissioner not less than twenty-one days' notice of his intention to apply for extension of the time for appeal.
- (5.) Where, upon an application for extension of the time for appeal, the Court extends the time for appeal, the person appealing shall serve on the Commissioner the notice of appeal together with a copy of the Order of the Court extending the time for appeal.
- (6.) Unless the Court otherwise orders, the date fixed for the hearing of the appeal shall be not less than thirty days after the service on the Commissioner of the notice of appeal.
- 11.—(1.) The allowance of the costs of and incidental to an appeal Costs of appeal. under section 20 of the Act (including an adjournment), or to an application for an extension of the time for appeal, to be paid by one party to another, shall be in the discretion of the County Court to which the application or appeal is made, and the Court shall have full power to allow or disallow the costs.
- (2.) A Court which allows costs in pursuance of the last preceding sub-regulation shall make an order directing by whom and to whom the costs are to be paid, and costs so awarded shall, in default of agreement between the parties as to the amount of the costs, be taxed according to the scale which would be applicable if the proceeding had been an action in the Court, and the laws in force for the time being with respect to the allowance and taxation of costs in an action in the Court and with respect to objections and the review of taxation by the taxing officer apply accordingly.
- (3.) Where the subject-matter of the application or appeal is not a capital sum, the Court shall, for the purpose of the allowance and the taxation of costs, direct what shall be considered to be the amount of the subject-matter of the application or appeal and, in default of a direction, the amount shall be fixed by the taxing officer, by whom the costs are to be taxed, subject to review by the Court.
- (4.) Where there is no provision for the taxing of costs in the Court, the Court shall, in default of agreement between the parties as to the amount of the costs, fix the amount of the costs.
- (5.) An order for the payment of costs made by the Court in pursuance of this regulation shall have the same force and effect in all respects as a judgment of the Court and the like proceedings (including proceedings in bankruptcy) may be taken upon the order as if it were a judgment of the Court for the amount of the costs.
- (6.) In this regulation, "taxing officer" means the Registrar, Clerk of the Court or other person having power to tax the costs of an action in the Court.

- 12. The Permanent Head or Chief Officer of each Department and Returns by authority shall furnish to the Commissioner not later than the thirty-first Departments. day of July, in each year, a correct return in accordance with Form E in the Schedule to these Regulations of payments made under the Act during the twelve months ended on the preceding thirtieth day of June.
- 13. As soon as possible after the close of each financial year, the Returns by Commissioner shall furnish to the Treasurer a correct return specifying—to Treasurer.
 - (a) the number of cases in respect of which compensation has been paid under the Act during that year;
 - (b) the amount of compensation paid during that year; and
 - (c) the amount paid in respect of medical and funeral expenses during that year.

The Trustees of the Canberra Public Cemetery;

Trustees of the Services Canteens Trust Fund.

15. Liability under the Act to pay compensation in respect of personal Special liability of injury by accident arising out of or in the course of the employment on a Commonwealth. rifle range of an employee of a State Rifle Association, District Rifle Club Union, Miniature Rifle Club Union, rifle club or miniature rifle club who is employed in the actual conduct of a rifle practice or competition, shall be borne by the Commonwealth.

16.—(1.) Where the Act provides that an amount of compensation shall Payment of be paid to the Commissioner and invested or applied or dealt with by him compensation to trustees. in such manner as he thinks fit for the benefit of the persons entitled to that amount, the Commissioner may-

- (a) in the case of death of the employee—pay the amount to a Savings Bank account in the name of the Commissioner specifying the persons so entitled; and
- (b) in any other case—pay the amount to such trustee or trustees as the Commissioner appoints to be held for the benefit of the persons so entitled upon such trusts as are approved by the Commissioner.
- (2.) Where the Commissioner pays the amount to a Savings Bank account in pursuance of the last preceding sub-regulation, the Commissioner may authorize, upon such conditions as he determines, a person to withdraw moneys from that account, and those moneys shall be dealt with for the benefit of the persons entitled to those moneys in such manner as the Commissioner directs.
- (3.) Where a determination is varied by the Commissioner in pursuance of paragraph (9.) of the First Schedule to the Act, a trust created under the Act or this regulation ceases and determines as from the date of the variation, and trust moneys then held shall be dealt with in such manner as the Commissioner directs.
- (4.) The determination of a trust by the operation of the last preceding sub-regulation does not prejudice a right of action against a trustee in respect of an act or omission occurring before the date of the variation.
 - 17. A declaration under these Regulations may be made before—

Declarations.

- (a) a member of the Parliament of the Commonwealth or of a State, or a councillor or alderman of a municipality or shire;
- (b) a commissioned officer of the Defence Force who has attained the age of twenty-one years;
- (c) a police, stipendiary or special magistrate of the Commonwealth or of a State:
- (d) a justice of the peace:
- (e) a barrister or solicitor, a notary public, a commissioner for affidavits, or a commissioner for declarations;
- (f) a legally qualified medical practitioner;
- (g) a minister of religion;
- (h) a member of the police force of the Commonwealth or of a
- (i) a permanent officer of the Public Service of the Commonwealth who has attained the age of twenty-one years;
- (j) a postmaster or postmistress, or person in charge of a post office;
- (k) a head-teacher of a State school.
- 18. Strict compliance with the forms in the Schedule to these Regulations Compliance with forms. is not necessary and substantial compliance is sufficient.
