REGULATIONS UNDER THE COCOS (KEELING) ISLANDS ACT 1955-1958.*

I THE ADMINISTRATOR of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955-1958*.

COCOS (KEELING) ISLANDS (CITIZENSHIP) REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Citation.
(Citizenship) Regulations.

2. The Cocos (Keeling) Islands (Citizenship) Regulations (comprising Repeal.
Statutory Rules 1955, No. 85; and 1958, No. 69) are repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“authorized officer”, in relation to the exercise of a power or
function under these Regulations, means a person authorized for
that purpose by the Minister;

“declarant” means a person who makes a declaration;

“declaration” means a declaration under section 14 of the Act;

“the Act” means the *Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955-1958*;

“The Secretary” means the Secretary to the Department of
Immigration.

4. A declaration shall be in accordance with the form in the Schedule Form of
to these Regulations. declaration.

5.—(1.) For the purpose of exercising a right to become an Australian Forwarding of
citizen conferred by section 14 of the Act, a person who makes a declaration declaration.
shall forward the declaration to, or lodge it with, the Secretary or an
authorized officer.

(2.) Where a declaration is forwarded to, or lodged with, an authorized
officer, that officer shall forward it to the Secretary.

7. The Secretary shall cause all registered declarations to be filed in the records of the Department of Immigration. Filing of
declaration.

9. If the Secretary is satisfied that the certified copy of a declaration has been lost or destroyed, the Secretary may supply a further certified copy of the declaration to the declarant.

11. A declaration may be made before a Commissioner for Declarations, Persons before whom declarations may be made.
a Justice of the Peace or an authorized officer.

Penalty: Fifty pounds or imprisonment for three months.
