Constitution Alteration (Aboriginals)

No. 55 of 1967

An Act to alter the Constitution so as to omit certain words relating to the People of the Aboriginal Race in any State and so that Aboriginals are to be counted in reckoning the Population.

[Assented to 10 August 1967]

B^E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the approval of the electors, as required by the Constitution, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Constitution Alteration (Aboriginals) Short title, 1967.
- 2. The Constitution is altered by omitting from paragraph (xxvi.) of section 51 the words ", other than the aboriginal race in any State,".
