## REGULATIONS UNDER THE PARLIAMENTARY COUNSEL ACT 1970.\*

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, I, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the Parliamentary Counsel Act 1970.

## PARLIAMENTARY COUNSEL REGULATIONS

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parliamentary Counsel Regulations. Citation.
- 2. In these Regulations-

Dafinitions.

- "Parliamentary Counsel" means the First Parliamentary Counsel or a Second Parliamentary Counsel;
- "the Act" means the Parliamentary Counsel Act 1970.
- 3. In respect of any period of office before the first day of January, 1971—
- In respect of any period of office before the first day of January, 1971—

  (a) there is payable to the First Parliamentary Counsel salary at the rate of Twenty-two thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars per year and an annual allowance at the rate of One thousand five hundred dollars per year; and per year; and

- (b) there is payable to a Second Parliamentary Counsel salary at the rate of Eighteen thousand five hundred dollars per year.
- 4.—(1.) Subject to regulation 6 of these Regulations, where a Parliamentary Travelling allowance. Counsel is necessarily absent from Canberra overnight in the course of performing his duties, travelling allowance is payable to him in accordance with this regulation.

- (2.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-regulation, travelling allowance in respect of the period of absence is payable to the First Parliamentary Counsel at the rate of Twenty-eight dollars per day and to a Second Parliamentary Counsel at the rate of Twenty-one dollars per day.
- (3.) Travelling allowance payable under this regulation is in addition to, and does not include, the cost of conveyance.

5. Subject to the next succeeding regulation, a Parliamentary Counsel is entitled to be paid such allowances, other than travelling allowance, as would be payable to him under the Public Service Regulations, as in force from time serving in to time, if he were an officer of the Public Service of the Commonwealth and Australia. were included-

- (a) in the case of the First Parliamentary Counsel—in the First Division;
- (b) in the case of a Second Parliamentary Counsel-in the Second Division.
- 6.—(1.) Where a Parliamentary Counsel performs duties outside Australia and the Territories of the Commonwealth, he is entitled to be paid such allowances in respect of services as he would be entitled to be paid—

  (1.) Where a Parliamentary Counsel performs duties outside Australia and

- (a) in the case of the First Parliamentary Counsel-if he were the Permanent Head of a Department and in receipt of salary equal to the salary payable to the Secretary to the Attorney-General's Department; or
- (b) in the case of a Second Parliamentary Counsel—if he were an officer of the Public Service of the Commonwealth and were included in the Second Division.
- (2.) A Parliamentary Counsel who is entitled to be paid travelling allowance in respect of a period under sub-regulation (1.) of this regulation is not entitled to be paid travelling allowance in respect of that period under regulation 4 of these Regulations.
