

Statutory Rules 1974 No. 183

REGULATIONS UNDER THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1922-1973.*

AMENDMENTS OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE (PARLIAMENTARY OFFICERS) REGULATIONS†

- 1. Regulation 23 of the Public Service (Parliamentary Officers) Regulations is repealed and the following regulation substituted:-
- "23. An officer shall not use for any purpose, other than for the discharge Public comment. of his official duties, information gained by or conveyed to him through his connexion with the Parliamentary Service.".
- 2. Regulation 55 of the Public Service (Parliamentary Officers) Regulations Meal is amended by omitting from sub-regulation (1) the figures "\$1.80" and sub-allowance. stituting the figures "\$2.00".
- 3. Regulation 57 of the Public Service (Parliamentary Officers) Regulations Rates of travelling allowance. is amended-
 - (a) by omitting from sub-regulation (1) the figures "\$28.00", "\$20.00", "\$19.65" and "\$14.75" and substituting the figures "\$31.50", "\$22.50", "\$22.50" and "\$17.00" respectively; and
 - (b) by omitting from sub-regulation (2) the figures "\$28.00" and substituting the figures "\$31.50".
- 4. Regulation 68A of the Public Service (Parliamentary Officers) Regulations Allowances is amended-
 - (a) by omitting from sub-regulation (4) the words "each mile" (first official occurring) and substituting the words "each bile-reter"

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(b) by omitting the table in sub-regulation (4) and substituting the following table:—

 - (b) by omitting the table in sub-regulation (2) and substituting the following table:—
