EXTRADITION (FOREIGN STATES) ACT 1974

No. 21 of 1974

An Act to amend sections 10 and 21 of the Extradition (Foreign States) Act 1966-1973.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, the Senate and the House of Representatives of Australia, as follows:—

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Extradition (Foreign States) Act Short title and citation. 1974.1
- (2) The Extradition (Foreign States) Act 1966-1973² is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Extradition (Foreign States) Act 1966-1974.
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives Commencethe Royal Assent.1
- 3. Section 10 of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end Act may be thereof the following sub-section:—

relation to foreign states regulation.

- "(4) Where the Governor-General is satisfied that, if this Act ap-by plied in relation to a foreign state, the law of that foreign state would, with or without any limitations, conditions, exceptions or qualifications, permit the surrender to Australia of persons accused or convicted of extraditable crimes within the meaning of Part IV who are found in that foreign state, or within the jurisdiction of, or of a part of, that foreign state, the regulations may provide that this Act applies in relation to that foreign state or that this Act applies in relation to that foreign state subject to limitations, conditions, exceptions or qualifications specified in the regulations.".
- 4. Section 21 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after the Requisition word "state" (second occurring) the words "(whether the extraditable to foreign crime is alleged to have been committed, or was committed, before or surrender of after the commencement of this Act or before or after the time when this person to be Act commenced to apply in relation to that state)".
