## REGULATION UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

**I** SIR JOHN MADDEN, acting as the Deputy of the Governor-General in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following regulation under the *War Precautions Act 1914-1916*, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF WAR PRECAUTIONS (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

After regulation 36 of the War Precautions (Supplementary) Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

“37. The following persons shall be exempt from serving as jurors, whether summoned so to serve under the law of the Commonwealth or of a State:—

Exemption of certain persons from serving as jurors.

Members of the Central Wool Committee;

Members of the Wool Committees of the various States; and

Appraisers appointed under the War Precautions (Wool) Regulations and the War Precautions (Sheepskins) Regulations.”
