A BILL

FOR

AN ACT

Relating to the Allowance to Members of each House of the Parliament of the Commonwealth.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Parliamentary Allowances Act* Short title,
5 1902.

2. (1) The allowance to each Senator under section forty-eight Allowance to
of the Constitution shall be reckoned— Members.

(a) in the case of a Senator chosen at the first election
10 after a dissolution of the Senate, from the day of
his election;

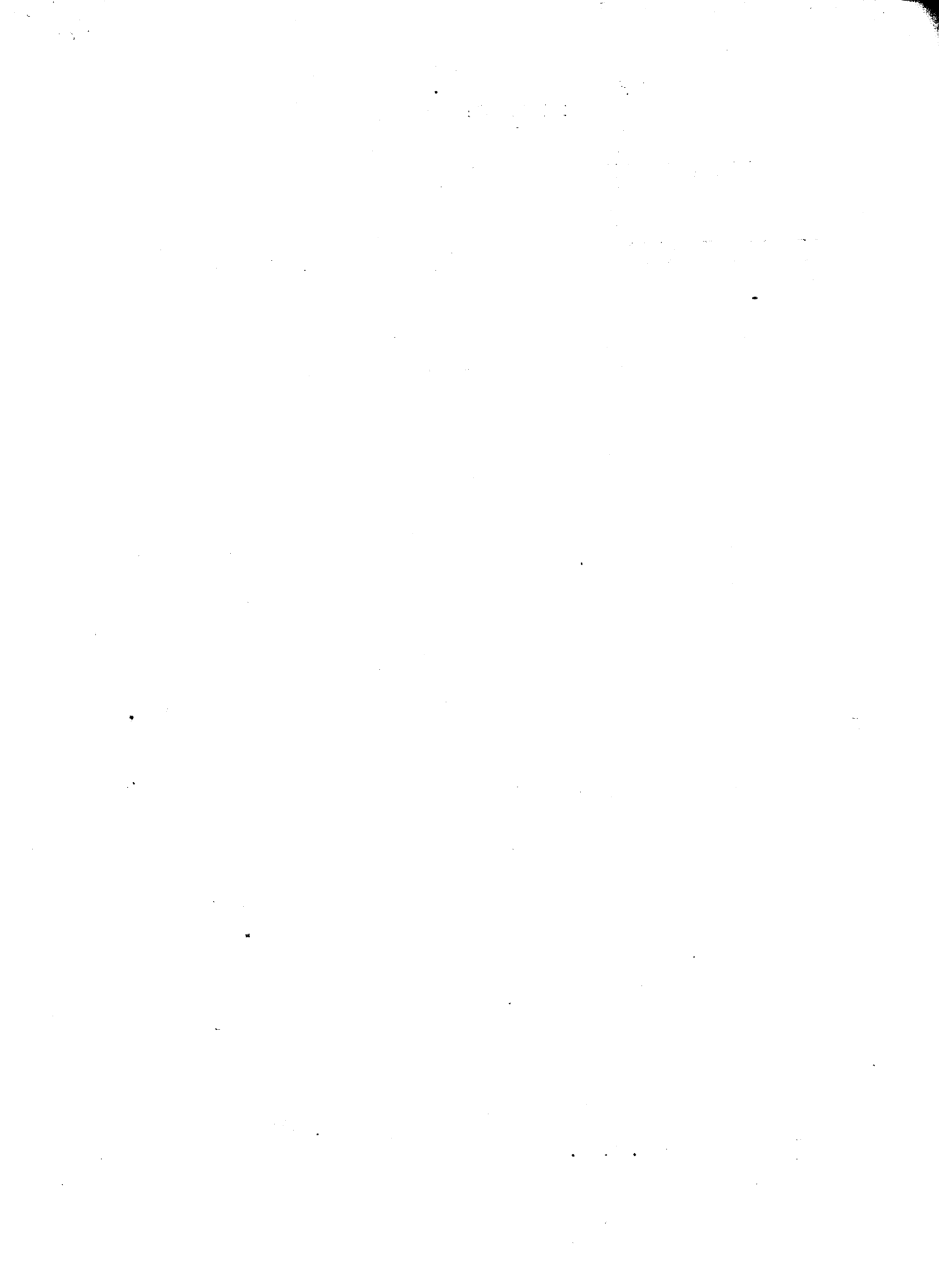
(b) in the case of a Senator chosen to fill a place which is
to become vacant in rotation, from the first day of
January following the day of his election;

(c) in the case of a Senator chosen or appointed to fill a
15 casual vacancy, from the day on which his name is
certified by the Governor of a State to the
Governor-General.

(2) The allowance to each Member of the House of Representa-
tives under section forty-eight of the Constitution shall be reckoned
20 from the day of his election.

PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES BILL.

Amendment made in Committee by the Senate.

Clause 2, line 18, after "allowance" omit remainder of clause, insert
"under section forty-eight of the Constitution to
each Member of the House of Representatives
shall be reckoned in the case of a Member
elected after the passing of this Act from the day
of his election."
