AN ACT

To encourage Manufactures in Australia by altering the provisions for bringing into operation Part VIA. of the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1902.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Manufactures Encouragement* Short title.

2. The heading to Division VIA. Metals and Machinery in the Amendment of
Division VIA. of
the Tariff. Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1902 is amended by omitting all words from and including the words "To come into operation" to and including the words "sufficiently established," and by
10 inserting the following words in lieu thereof:—

15 "The operation of this Division is suspended as to the articles of manufacture specified therein, which (except Iron Galvanized, Plate, and Sheet) are exempt from duty until this Division is brought into operation.

"This Division may, by Proclamation, be brought into operation as to any such article from a date specified in the Proclamation.

20 "Provided, however, that no Proclamation bringing this Division into operation as to any article shall be made until the Governor-General is satisfied that the manufacture of the article (or, in the case of a Proclamation bringing this Division into operation as to Scrap Iron or Scrap Steel, is satisfied that the manufacture of Iron or Steel) from Australian ore or material is sufficiently established
25 in the Commonwealth."



This Bill originated in the House of Representatives; and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Senate for its concurrence.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

"Provided, however, that no Proclamation bringing this Division into operation as to any article shall be made until the Minister for Trade and Customs certifies that the manufacture of the article (or, in the case of a Proclamation bringing this Division into operation as to Scrap Iron or Scrap Steel, certifies that the manufacture of Iron or Steel) from Australian ore or material is sufficiently established in the Commonwealth, and the certificate has been affirmed by joint addresses passed on the motion of Ministers by both Houses of Parliament."
