A BILL

FOR

AN ACT

To amend the *Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1912*
and the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902-1911*.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate,
and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
Australia, as follows :—

5 1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Act* Short title and

(2.) The *Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1912*, as amended by this
Act, may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1913*.

(3.) The *Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902-1911*, as amended
by this Act, may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act*
10 1902-1913.

2. Section twenty-eight of the *Post and Telegraph Act* 1901-1912 is amended—

(a) by omitting from sub-section (1) thereof the words “and printed and published within the Commonwealth for sale, if—”, and by inserting in their stead the words “and—” 5

(i) printed and published within the Commonwealth for sale, or

(ii) registered, in any part of the King's Dominions to which the Governor-General by proclamation declares that the provisions of this section extend, for transmission through the post as a newspaper, if—”, and 10

(b) by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:— 15

“(3.) The Governor-General may by proclamation declare that the provisions of this section shall extend to any part of the King's Dominions which permits newspapers, printed and published in Australia and posted in that part, to be transmitted through the post at the same rates of postage as newspapers printed and published in that part.” 20

4. The Second Schedule to the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act* 1902-1911 is amended by adding, after Part II., the following Part:—

“PART III.—LETTER TELEGRAMS, AS PRESCRIBED.

Including address and signature— 30

Not exceeding 40 words One shilling.

Each additional word One halfpenny ”
