A BILL

FOR

AN ACT

To amend Section One hundred and twelve of the *Customs Act 1901-1910.*

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Customs Act 1914.*

Short title and citation.

5 (2.) The *Customs Act 1901-1910*, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Customs Act 1901-1910.*

2. Section one hundred and twelve of the *Customs Act 1901-1910* is amended—

Amendment of s. 112

10 (a) by inserting after sub-section (1.) the following sub-section:—

“(1A.) In time of war the Governor-General may by proclamation prohibit the exportation of any goods.”; and

15 (b) by inserting in sub-section (2.), after the words “sub-section (1.)”, the words “or (1A.)”.

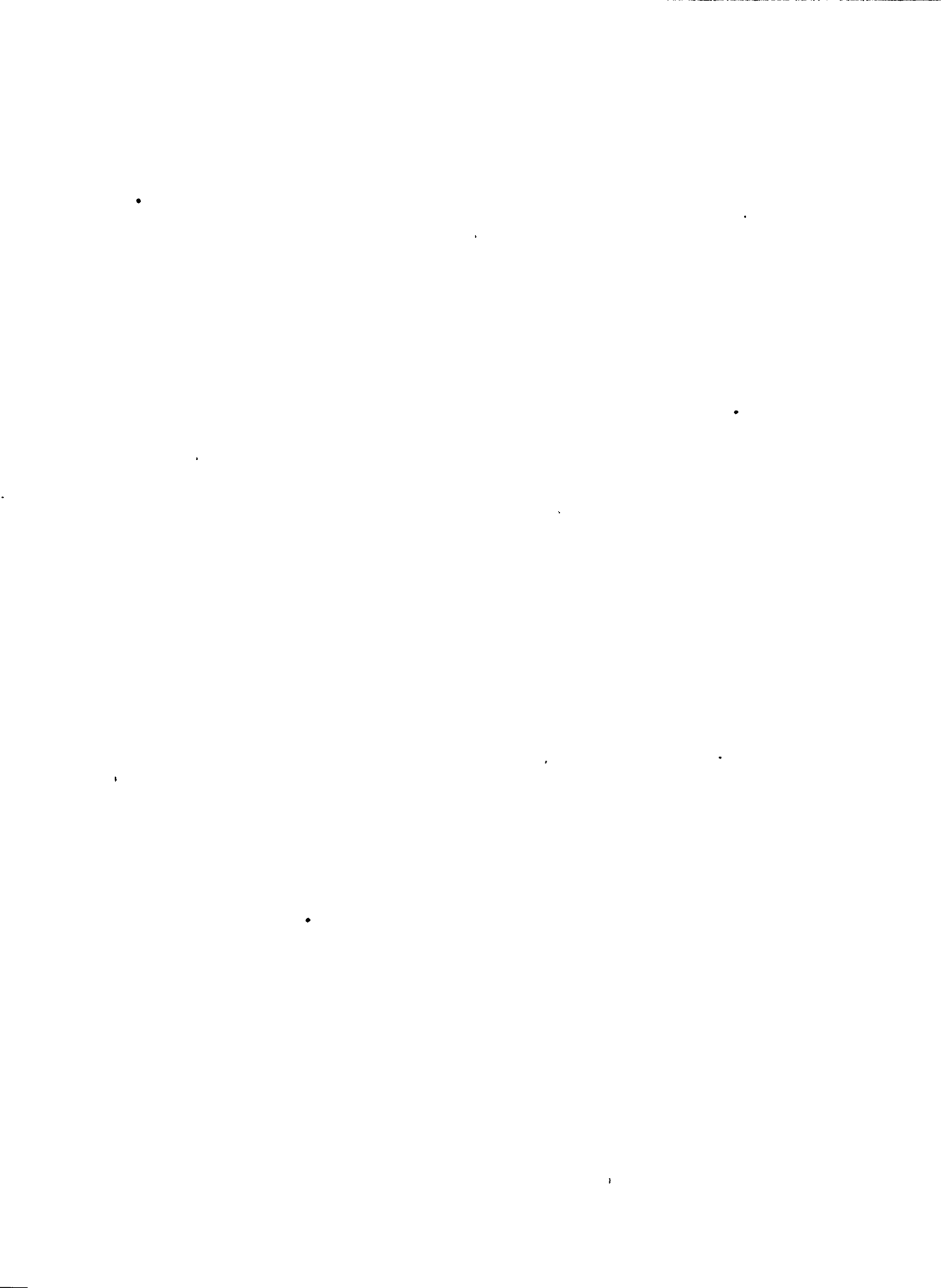
