This Bill originated in the House of Representatives; and having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Senate for its concurrence.

A BILL

FOR

AN ACT

To Authorize the Survey of Route for a Railway to connect Kalgoorlie, in the State of Western Australia, with Port Augusta, in the State of South Australia.

E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Kalgoorlie to Port Augusta Railway Short title. Survey Act 1904.
 - 2. The Minister may cause a survey to be made of a route for a Power to make railway to connect Kalgoorlie, in the State of Western Australia, with Port Augusta, in the State of South Australia.
- 3. The cost of the survey authorized by this Act shall not exceed Appropriation of moneys. Twenty thousand pounds, and shall be charged on and paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, which is hereby appropriated accordingly.
