## A BILL

FOR

## AN ACT

To amend the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act*  
1902-1923.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

- 5 1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act* 1924. Short title and citation.
- (2.) The *Post and Telegraph Rates Act* 1902-1923 is, in this Act; referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Rates Act* 1902-1924.
- 10 2. This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three. Commencement
3. The Second Schedule of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following Part:— Meteorological telegrams.
- 15 “PART V.—METEOROLOGICAL TELEGRAMS.  
“Meteorological Telegrams transmitted to or from Commonwealth meteorological offices or stations—Free.”
