A BILL

FOR

AN ACT

To amend the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1929*.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1930*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1929** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1930*.

2. This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the seventh day of October One thousand nine hundred and thirty. Commencement.

3. After section six of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“6A. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, bounty shall not be payable under this Act upon any goods manufactured in Australia and delivered from a factory during any period during which the importation of those goods is prohibited by or under the law relating to the Customs, whether or not such prohibition is absolute or subject to conditions.” Bounty not payable during prohibition of importation.
