4 The Parliament of Australia enacts:

5 **1 Short title**

6 This Act may be cited as the *Broadcasting Legislation Amendment*
7 *(Anti-Siphoning) Act 2010*.

8 **2 Commencement**

9 This Act commences on the day on which it receives the Royal
10 Assent.

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3 Schedule(s)

- (1) Each Act, and each instrument, that is specified in a Schedule to this Act is amended or repealed as set out in the applicable items in the Schedule concerned, and any other item in a Schedule to this Act has effect according to its terms.
- (2) The amendment of an instrument under subsection (1) does not prevent the instrument, as so amended, from being amended by the Minister in accordance with section 115 of the *Broadcasting Services Act 1992*.

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Schedule 1—Amendments continuing the anti-siphoning list under the Broadcasting Services Act

Broadcasting Services Act 1992

1 At the end of section 115

Add:

(4) A notice under this section which has the effect of:

(a) amending a notice under subsection (1) to remove an event from that notice; or

(b) revoking a notice, or any part of a notice, under subsection (1); or

(c) placing a time limit on the operation of a notice, or any part of a notice, under subsection (1);

does not come into effect until the expiration of 6 sitting days of each House of the Parliament after the notice is tabled in that House.
