1 Name of Determination

This Determination is the *Financial Management and Accountability Determination 2005/37 — Consular Services Account Variation and Abolition 2005*.

2 Commencement

This Determination commences at the time at which subsection 22 (4) of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997* is complied with.

Note This Determination takes effect in accordance with section 22 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*. The Parliament must consider the Determination before it can take effect, and either House may pass a resolution disallowing the Determination. If neither House passes such a resolution, the Determination takes effect on the day immediately after the last day upon which such a resolution could have been passed.

3 Variation of Determination to Establish Components of the Reserved Money Fund

Schedule 1 varies the Initial Determination to Establish Components of the Reserved Money Fund that included the establishment of the Consular Services Reserve.

Note Section 5 of the *Financial Management Legislation Amendment Act 1999* changed 'Reserve' to 'Account' in the titles of all Components of the Reserved Money Fund

4 Abolition of Consular Services Account

The Consular Services Account is abolished with effect from the time at which:

- (a) Schedule 1 has taken effect; and
- (b) the balance of the appropriation for the Consular Services Account reaches zero.
