Charter of the United Nations (Sanctions—Rwanda) Regulations

I, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, make the following Regulations under the *Charter of the United Nations Act 1945*.

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Charter of the United Nations (Sanctions—Rwanda) Regulations.

[NOTE: These Regulations commence on gazettal: see *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*, s. 48.]

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:

“registered aircraft” means an aircraft registered in Australia under the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*;

“registered ship” means a ship registered under the *Shipping Registration Act 1981*.

Application of the Regulations

3. These Regulations have extra-territorial operation according to their terms.

Prohibition on supplying certain goods to Rwanda

4. (1) A citizen of Australia who is outside Australia must not, intentionally or recklessly, supply goods specified in the Schedule to:

- (a) a person or body in Rwanda; or
- (b) a person or body for the purpose of a business carried on in, or operated from, Rwanda;

unless the goods are supplied for the purpose of aiding the activities of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda or the United Nations Observer Mission in Uganda-Rwanda.

Penalty: 50 penalty units.

(2) The owner, the master and the operator of a registered ship must not, intentionally or recklessly, allow the ship to be used to supply goods specified in the Schedule to:

- (a) a person or body in Rwanda; or
- (b) a person or body for the purpose of a business carried on in, or operated from, Rwanda;

unless the goods are supplied for the purpose of aiding the activities of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda or the United Nations Observer Mission in Uganda-Rwanda.

Penalty: 50 penalty units.

(3) The owner, the pilot in command and the operator of a registered aircraft must not, intentionally or recklessly, allow the aircraft to be used to supply goods specified in the Schedule to:

- (a) a person or body in Rwanda; or
- (b) a person or body for the purpose of a business carried on in, or operated from, Rwanda;

unless the goods are supplied for the purpose of aiding the activities of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda or the United Nations Observer Mission in Uganda-Rwanda.

Penalty for a contravention of this subregulation: 50 penalty units.
