## REGULATIONS UNDER THE AIR FORCE ACT 1923.\*

## AMENDMENTS OF THE AIR FORCE REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations, any reference to a regulation shall be read interpretation. as a reference to a regulation contained in the Air Force Regulations, as amended to the date of commencement of these Regulations.
- 2. Regulation 49 is amended by omitting from paragraph (d) the pranches word "quartermaster" and inserting in its stead the words "commissioned warrant officer".
- 3.—(1.) Regulation 54x is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:
- "54A. A commission in the commissioned warrant officer branch Appointment of the Permanent Air Force with the rank on appointment of flying warrant officer may be granted on the recommendation of, and subject to conditions approved by, the Air Board to a warrant officer or a noncommissioner officer who has passed the examination for promotion to warrant officer.".

(2.) An officer appointed to be quartermaster and granted a commission in the quartermaster branch under the regulation repealed by this regulation and holding office at the date of commencement of this regulation shall be deemed to have been granted a commission in the commissioned warrant officer branch as if this regulation had been in force when he was so appointed and he had been granted a commission hereunder.

- 5. After regulation 65 the following regulation is inserted:

"65A. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, promotton of stying officer of the commissioned warrant officer branch may, after a commissioned syears' continuous service therein, be promoted to the rank of warrant officer branch as all that lieutenant without being required to pass an examination.".

6. Regulation 79 is amended by omitting from sub-regulation (2.) without examination. a flying officer of the commissioned warrant officer branch may, after five years' continuous service therein, be promoted to the rank of flight lieutenant without being required to pass an examination.".

7. Regulations 80, 82 and 83 are repealed,

8. Regulation 87 is amended by omitting the words "Unattached or Notification of address." Retired List" and inserting in their stead the words "Retired List".

9. Regulation 88 is amended by omitting sub-regulation (1.) and nettring

"(1.) The ages for compulsory retirement of officers shall be in accordance with the following table:-

Regulation 534 is amended by inserting after the word "years" When "married" the words ", but does not include a member who has been divorced by allowance markets. his wife unless the Minister, on the recommendation of the Air Board, and able. directs that, owing to exceptional circumstances, that member shall be regarded as a married member".

11. Regulation 547 is amended by omitting sub-regulation (3.) and Active may hates.

inserting in its stead the following sub-regulation: -

"(3.) An officer of the commissioned warrant officer branch shall be paid consolidated pay and allowances in accordance with the following table: -

- 12. Regulation 548 is amended by omitting from sub-regulation Deterred Pay (2.) the words "a quartermaster holding an honorary commission" Rates. and inserting in their stead the words "an officer of the commissioned warrant officer branch".
- 13. Regulation 578 is amended by omitting from the table in sub-Travelling regulation (1.) the word "Quartermaster" and inserting in its stead the words "Commissioned warrant officer".
- 14. Regulation 615 is amended by inserting in sub-regulation (5.), conditions after the word "leave", the words "of any kind".
- 15. Regulation 642 is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:--
- "642.—(1.) When in camp or in bivouse, or when travelling with Camp or field allowance. personnel by road, an officer or sergeant-major, Class I., may be allowed camp or field allowance in accordance with the following table:-

- (2.) A chaplain detailed for duty at a camp of training shall be granted, irrespective of his classification-
  - (a) a field allowance of Three shillings and sixpence per day, and rations for each day of his authorized attendance at that camp; and
  - (b) travelling allowance at the rate of One pound per day, whilst proceeding to and from camp, except when accompanying personnel who are rationed.".
