PAPUA NEW GUINEA INDEPENDENCE (AUSTRALIAN CITIZENSHIP OF YOUNG PERSONS) REGULATIONS

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Papua New Guinea Citation
Independence (Australian Citizenship of Young Persons) Regulations.

2. A person who on Independence Day—

- (a) was under 19 years of age;
- (b) was not for the purposes of section 64 of the Constitution
of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea a person
who was never granted a right (whether revocable or not)
to permanent residence in Australia; and
- (c) ceased to be an Australian citizen,

3. On renouncing Australian citizenship and making the Declaration of Loyalty in accordance with the Constitution of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, a person referred to in regulation 2 ceases to be an Australian citizen.
