- (2) For subregulation (1), Abu Sayyaf Group is also known by the following names:
 - (a) Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG);
 - (b) Al Harakat Al Islamiyya (AHAI);
 - (c) Al Harakat-ul Al Islamiyya;
 - (d) Al-Harakatul-Islamia;
 - (e) Al Harakat Al Aslamiya:
 - (f) Abou Sayaf Armed Band (ASAB);
