INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE 1960.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Interpretation* Short title and citation, Ordinance 1960.*

- (2.) The Interpretation Ordinance 1958† is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Interpretation Ordinance 1958-1960.
- 2. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Interpretation of terms. inserting in sub-section (1.), after the definition of "magistrate", the following definition:—

"'medical practitioner' means a person who is regis-tered or licensed as a medical practitioner under a law of a State or Territory of the Common-wealth, or under a law of the United Kingdom, that provides for the registration or licensing of medical practitioners;".
