1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Aviation Transport Security Amendment Regulations 2006 (No. 1)*.

2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on 27 February 2006.

3 Amendment of *Aviation Transport Security Regulations 2005*

Schedule 1 amends the *Aviation Transport Security Regulations 2005*.

Schedule 1 Amendment

(regulation 3)

[1] Regulation 9.01

substitute

9.01 Threats regarding aviation security

- (1) A person must not, while at a security controlled airport or on board an aircraft, engage in conduct that a reasonable person could interpret as a threat to commit an act of unlawful interference with aviation.

Penalty: 50 penalty units.

- (2) An offence against subregulation (1) is an offence of strict liability.

Examples of conduct for subregulation (1)

Making jokes about bombs in baggage

Leaving articles of baggage unattended.
