EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Private Health Insurance Act 2007

Private Health Insurance (Benefit Requirements) Rules 2007 (No. 2)

Section 333-20 of the *Private Health Insurance Act 2007* (the Act) provides that the Minister may make *Private Health Insurance (Benefit Requirements) Rules* (the Rules) providing for matters required or permitted by Part 3-3 of the Act, or necessary or convenient in order to carry out or give effect to Part 3-3 of the Act.

The current Rules, dated 30 March 2007 (amended on 26 April 2007), provide for the minimum benefit requirements for psychiatric, rehabilitation and palliative care and other hospital treatment which prior to 1 April 2007 were covered by provisions in Schedule 1, paragraph (1)(bj) of the *National Health Act 1953*. Schedules 1 to 6 to the Rules set out the minimum levels of benefit which are payable for hospital treatment. Namely, benefits for overnight accommodation (Schedules 1 and 2), same day accommodation (Schedule 3), nursing-home type patients (Schedule 4), second-tier default benefits (Schedule 5), and outreach services (Schedule 6).

The *Private Health Insurance* (Benefit Requirements) Rules 2007 (No. 2) (these Rules) commence on 1 July 2007. These Rules revoke and remake the *Private Health Insurance* (Benefit Requirements) Rules 2007, as amended.

The Rules make minor changes to all the Schedules to the Rules as set out below.

Amendments to Schedule 1, 2, 3 and 6

Schedules 1, 2, 3, and 6 set out amended minimum benefit levels in regard to overnight accommodation, overnight shared ward accommodation, same day accommodation and outreach services. These accommodation components are subject to annual review and are amended with reference to Consumer Price Index (CPI) movements from March to March each year. In the year from March 2006 to March 2007 there was an increase of 2.4% in the CPI. These Rules reflect this increase in the CPI, and will be effective for the financial year 2007-2008. Queensland has based its increase on the December to December CPI movement. For the December 2005 to December 2006 there was an increase of 3.3%, this is reflected in Schedule 2.

Schedule 1 has also been amended to correct a numbering sequence error in Subsection 4(3) for item numbers 35009 and 35307. This edit has no impact on the benefit level paid.

Schedule 3 has also been amended to include MBS item 81115 in the Type C List, Category 8 – services provided by nurses, allied and dental health professionals items provided, at clause 8 of Part 3 of Schedule 3 of the Rules.

Amendments to Schedule 4

Schedule 4 sets out the minimum benefit payable for patients that are classified as nursing home type patients (NHTP) in particular State/Territories and private hospitals within Australia. These Rules amend the minimum benefit per night for Queensland, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory public hospitals.

Amendments to Schedule 5

Schedule 5 requires a health insurer to pay second tier default benefits for most episodes of hospital treatment provided in private hospital facilities that are specified in Schedule 5 with which the health insurer does not have a negotiated agreement with the hospital. Schedule 5 sets a higher minimum level of benefit (for overnight treatment and day only treatment provided in specified facilities) than the minimum benefit set for such treatment by Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 6 of the Rules.

Changes to Facilities Specified as Eligible for Second Tier Default Benefits

These Rules specifies 57 new facilities to be entitled to second tier default benefits. The new facilities are:

Consultation

The amendments made to Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 6 of the Rules reflect the increase in default benefits due to the CPI change from the March 2006 to March 2007. The increases to the minium benefits in public hospitals were made with the agreement of the relevant State or Territory Health Authority. Queensland Health advised its increases is 3.3% due to the CPI change from December 2005 to December 2006, on which their rates have been based.

The amendments made to Schedule 4 relate to default benefits for Nursing Home Type Patients in public hospitals in Queensland, Western Australia and the Australian Capital Territory. Increases to the minium benefits for public hospitals were made with the agreement of the relevant State or Territory Health Authority.

Consultation for changes to Schedule 5 occurred with industry through the Second Tier Advisory Committee, which includes equal representation from both the private hospital and health fund sectors.
