1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the Criminal Code Amendment Regulations 2009 (No. 2).

2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on the day after they are registered.

4I Terrorist organisations — Asbat al-Ansar (AAA)

- (1) For paragraph (b) of the definition of *terrorist organisation* in subsection 102.1 (1) of the Code, the organisation known as Asbat al-Ansar (AAA) is specified.
- (2) For subregulation (1), Asbat al-Ansar (AAA) is also known by the following names:
 - (a) Band of Helpers;
 - (b) Band of Partisans;
 - (c) Esbat al-Ansar;
 - (d) Isbat al-Ansar;
 - (e) League of Partisans;
 - (f) League of the Followers;
 - (g) Osbat al-Ansar;

- (h) Partisans' League;
- (i) Usbat al-Ansar;
- (j) Usbat ul-Ansar.
