

# Extradition (Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Amendment Regulations 2009 (No. 1)<sup>1</sup>

## 1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Extradition* (Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Amendment Regulations 2009 (No. 1).

#### 2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on the day after they are registered.

# 3 Amendment of Extradition (Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Regulations 2002

Schedule 1 amends the *Extradition (Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Regulations* 2002.

#### 4 Extradition countries

For the definition of *extradition country* in section 5 of the Act, a country, or a colony, territory or protectorate of a country, for which the Convention is in force is an extradition country.

Note 1 For when the Convention enters into force for a State, see Article 22 of the Convention.
