1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Extradition (Physical Protection of Nuclear Material) Amendment Regulations 2009 (No. 1)*.

2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on the day after they are registered.

3 Amendment of *Extradition (Physical Protection of Nuclear Material) Regulations 1988*

Schedule 1 amends the *Extradition (Physical Protection of Nuclear Material) Regulations 1988*.

Schedule 1 Amendments

3 Extradition countries

For the definition of *extradition country* in section 5 of the Act, a country, or a colony, territory or protectorate of a country, for which the Physical Protection Convention is in force is an extradition country.

Note 1 For when the Convention enters into force for a State, see Article 19 of the Convention.

4 Application of the Act

The Act applies, subject to the Physical Protection Convention, to an extradition country mentioned in regulation 3.
