## **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

The instrument to which this explanatory statement relates	Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 Determination 2010/16 – Section 32 (Transfer of Functions from DEWHA to DCCEE)
Date instrument was made	6 August 2010
The legislative authority under which the instrument is made	Subsection 32(2) of the <i>Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997</i> (FMA Act) enables the Minister for Finance and Deregulation (Finance Minister) to determine that one or more Schedules to one or more Appropriation Acts are amended in relation to the transfer of a function from one agency to another.
	Under section 62 of the FMA Act the Finance Minister has delegated this power to the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Deregulation (Finance). Under section 53 of the FMA Act, the Secretary of Finance has delegated this power to certain officials within Finance.
Purpose and effect of the instrument	Schedule 1 of this Instrument amends the <i>Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2010-2011</i> to transfer an amount of \$40,541,000.00 of the departmental item from the Department of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts (DEWHA) to the Department of Climate Change and Energy Efficiency (DCCEE).
	The effect of this schedule is to reduce the departmental item in <i>Appropriation Act</i> ( <i>No. 1</i> ) 2010-2011 for DEWHA and increase the departmental item in <i>Appropriation Act</i> ( <i>No. 1</i> ) 2010-2011 for DCCEE.
Background	The appropriation amount transferred relates to the transfer of energy efficiency functions from DEWHA to DCCEE as reflected in changes to the <i>Administrative Arrangements Order</i> on 8 March 2010.
Notes on the Instrument	In accordance with Part 3 of the <i>Legislative Instruments Act 2003</i> , DEWHA and DCCEE were consulted in the preparation of this instrument. This Determination is a legislative instrument for the purposes of section 5 of the <i>Legislative Instruments Act 2003</i> .
