

## Law Enforcement Integrity Commissioner Amendment Regulations 2010 (No. 1)<sup>1</sup>

#### 1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Law Enforcement Integrity Commissioner Amendment Regulations 2010 (No. 1).*

These Regulations commence on 1 January 2011.

**ACBPS** means the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service.

#### 4 Head of government agency

For the definition of **head** of a government agency in subsection 5 (1) of the Act, the head of the ACBPS is the CEO of the ACBPS appointed under section 5 of the *Customs Administration Act* 1985.

#### 6 Law enforcement agency

For paragraph (d) of the definition of *law enforcement agency* in subsection 5 (1) of the Act, the ACBPS is prescribed.

#### 8 Staff members

For subsection 10 (4) of the Act, the following persons are staff members of the ACBPS:

- (a) the CEO of the ACBPS;
- (b) persons engaged under the *Public Service Act 1999* to assist the CEO in accordance with section 15 of the *Customs Administration Act 1985*.

#### 9 Secondees

For paragraph 10 (5) (d) of the Act, a person is a secondee of the ACBPS if the person is:

- (a) not employed in the ACBPS; and
- (b) is authorised in writing by the CEO of the ACBPS to perform a function or functions of a person employed in the ACBPS.
