

## EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

<p><b>The instrument to which this explanatory statement relates</b></p>	<p><i>Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 Determination 2011/16 – Section 32 (Transfer of Functions from HEALTH to ANPHA)</i></p>
<p><b>Date instrument was made</b></p>	<p>25 August 2011</p>
<p><b>The legislative authority under which the instrument is made</b></p>	<p>Subsection 32(2) of the <i>Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997</i> (FMA Act) enables the Minister for Finance and Deregulation (Finance Minister) to determine that one or more Schedules to one or more Appropriation Acts are amended in relation to the transfer of a function from one agency to another.</p> <p>Under section 62 of the FMA Act the Finance Minister has delegated this power to the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Deregulation (Finance). Under section 53 of the FMA Act, the Secretary of Finance has delegated this power to certain officials within Finance.</p>
<p><b>Purpose and effect of the instrument</b></p>	<p>Schedule 1 of this Instrument amends <i>Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2011-2012</i> to transfer an amount of \$11,823,000.00 of the administered item for the Department of Health and Ageing (HEALTH) alongside Outcome 1 to the administered item for the Australian National Preventative Health Agency (ANPHA) alongside Outcome 1.</p> <p>The effect of this schedule is to transfer appropriations relating to the National Binge Drinking Strategy (NBDS) expansion function as agreed by the Prime Minister on 28 June 2011.</p>
<p><b>Background</b></p>	<p>Responsibility for the NBDS expansion function was transferred from HEALTH to ANPHA due to a request from Minister Roxon that was approved by the Prime Minister on 28 June 2011</p>
<p><b>Notes on the Instrument</b></p>	<p>In accordance with Part 3 of the <i>Legislative Instruments Act 2003</i>, FHCSIA and SEWPaC were consulted in the preparation of this instrument. This Determination is a legislative instrument for the purposes of section 5 of the <i>Legislative Instruments Act 2003</i>.</p>
