Date instrument was made	16 April 2012
The legislative authority under which the instrument is made	Subsection 32(2) of the <i>Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997</i> (FMA Act) enables the Minister for Finance and Deregulation (Finance Minister) to determine that one or more Schedules to one or more Appropriation Acts are amended in relation to the transfer of a function from one agency to another.
	Under section 62 of the FMA Act the Finance Minister has delegated this power to the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Deregulation (Finance). Under section 53 of the FMA Act, the Secretary of Finance has delegated this power to certain officials within Finance.
Purpose and effect of the instrument	Schedule 1 of this Instrument amends <i>Appropriation Act</i> ( <i>No. 1</i> ) 2010-2011 to:
	• Reduce the "Departmental" item opposite "Total: Department of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts" for DEWHA by \$1,077,180.03.
	Schedule 2 of this Instrument amends <i>Appropriation Act</i> ( <i>No. 1</i> ) 2011-2012 to:
	<ul> <li>Reduce the "Departmental" item opposite "Total:         Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water,         Population and Communities" for SEWPaC by         \$321,864.19;</li> </ul>
	• Increase the "Departmental" item opposite "Total: Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs" for FaHCSIA by \$1,112,145.37; and
	• Increase the "Departmental" item opposite "Total: Department of the Treasury" for TREASURY by \$286,898.85.
	The effect of these schedules is to transfer appropriations relating to Housing Affordability from SEWPaC to FaHCSIA and appropriations relating to Housing Supply Policy from SEWPaC to TREASURY.
Background	Due to a change to the Administrative Arrangements Order on 14 December 2011, the Housing Affordability function was transferred from SEWPaC to FaHCSIA and the Housing Supply Policy function was transferred from SEWPaC to TREASURY.
