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Part 1—Preliminary

1 Name

- (1)This instrument is the Migration (IMMI 18/039: Mandatory Skills Assessment-Subclass 482 Visa) Instrument 2018.
- (2)This instrument may be cited as IMMI 18/039.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subregulation 2.26B(1) and paragraph 1240(3)(g) of Schedule 1 to the Migration Regulations 1994.

4 Definitions

Note:

A number of expressions used in this instrument are defined in the Regulations, including the following:

- (a) AUD;
- (b) Hong Kong;
- (c) Macau;
- (d) standard business sponsor.

In this instrument:

ANZSCO is specified to mean, for the definition of ANZSCO in regulation 1.03 of the Regulations, the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics, as in force on 23 November 2022.

exempt applicant: see subsections 7(1), (2) and (4).

nec is short for not elsewhere classified.

permitted foreign country: see subsection 7(3).

Regulations means the Migration Regulations 1994.

TRA means Trades Recognition Australia.

VETASSESS means Vocational Education and Training Assessment Services.

Part 2—Specification of occupations etc. for Subclass 482 visa

5 Specification of occupations etc.

- (1) This section applies in relation to an application by a person seeking to satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a Subclass 482 (Skills in Demand) visa.
- (2) For the purposes of subregulation 2.26B(1) of, and subparagraphs 1240(3)(g)(ii), (iii) and (iv) of Schedule 1 to,the Regulations:
 - (a) an occupation mentioned in column 1 of an item of the following table is specified; and
 - (aa) the class of persons is specified to be the persons mentioned in subsection (1); and
 - (b) a person or body mentioned in column 3 of the item is specified as the relevant assessing authority for:
 - (i) the skilled occupation; and
 - (ii) all countries; and
 - for the purposes of an application for a skills assessment made by a resident of one of those countries; and
 - (c) the type of assessment mentioned in column 4 of the item is specified for the occupation; and
 - (d) the 3 year period ending immediately before the day the application is made is specified.
 - Note: Column 2 of the following table sets out the ANZSCO code for each specified occupation. This is included for information only.

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7 Exempt applicant for an occupation

- A person who has applied for a Subclass 482 (Skills in Demand) visa is an *exempt applicant* for an occupation mentioned in column 1 of an item of the table in section 6 if:
 - (a) all of the following apply in relation to the person:
 - the person holds a Subclass 457 (Temporary Work (Skilled)) visa, Subclass 482 (Temporary Skill Shortage) visa or Subclass 482 (Skills in Demand) visa;
 - (ii) the person satisfied the primary criteria for the grant of that visa;
 - (iii) the person is employed in Australia in the nominated occupation to which the application relates; or
 - (b) both of the following apply in relation to the person:
 - the person is employed by a company operating an established business overseas in the same occupation as, or a similar occupation to, the nominated occupation to which the application relates;
 - (ii) the person is nominated by a standard business sponsor who is that company or an associated entity of that company.
- (2) A person who has applied for a Subclass 482 (Skills in Demand) visa is an exempt applicant for an occupation mentioned in column 1 of an item of the table (other than item 21) in section 6 if:
 - (a) both of the following apply in relation to the person:
 - the person holds a relevant qualification for the nominated occupation to which the application relates that is commensurate with the qualification specified for the occupation in ANZSCO;
 - (ii) the qualification was obtained as a result of the successful completion of a course of study or training in Australia or a permitted country for the occupation; or
 - (b) both of the following apply in relation to the person:
 - the nominated occupation to which the application relates requires the person to hold a licence, registration or membership to perform the occupation;
 - (ii) the person has been granted that license, registration or membership; or
 - (c) the person has met the standards set by TRA under the Offshore Skills Assessment Program for the nominated occupation to which the application relates.

- (3) A *permitted foreign country* for an occupation mentioned in column 1 of an item of the table in section 6 is a foreign country, or a Special Administrative Region of a foreign country, that is not mentioned in column 2 of that item.
- (4) A person who has applied for a Subclass 482 (Skills in Demand) visa is an *exempt applicant* for an occupation mentioned in item 21 of column 1 of the table in section 6 if:
 - (a) the person holds a relevant qualification for the nominated occupation to which the application relates that is commensurate with the qualification specified for the occupation in ANZSCO; and
 - (b) the person will receive annual earnings of at least AUD180,000; and
 - (c) the person is nominated by a standard business sponsor who has been given accredited status by the Department.

8 Application of amendments made by LIN 24/094

The amendments of this instrument made by Schedule 1 to the *Migration Amendment (Skills in Demand Visa and Related Matters) Instrument 2024* (the *amending instrument*) apply in relation to an application for a visa that is made on or after the commencement of the amending instrument.
