# About this compilation

## This compilation

This is a compilation of the *National Health (Application Fees for Pharmacist Approvals)*Determination 2020 that shows the text of the law as amended and in force on 1 July 2020 (the *compilation date*).

## 3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsection 90(10) of the *National Health Act* 1953.

## 4 Fees for applications

The application fee for an application under subsection 90(1) or (3) of the *National Health Act 1953* is:

- (a) if the application must be referred to the Authority under subsection 90(3A) of the Act—\$2,860; and
- (b) otherwise—\$920.

Note: The Authority mentioned in subsection 90(3A) of the *National Health Act 1953* is the Australian Community Pharmacy Authority.

## Abbreviation key—Endnote 2

## Legislation history and amendment history—Endnotes 3 and 4

Amending laws are annotated in the legislation history and amendment history.

The legislation history in endnote 3 provides information about each law that has amended (or will amend) the compiled law. The information includes commencement details for amending laws and details of any application, saving or transitional provisions that are not included in this compilation.

The amendment history in endnote 4 provides information about amendments at the provision (generally section or equivalent) level. It also includes information about any provision of the compiled law that has been repealed in accordance with a provision of the law.

#### **Editorial changes**

The *Legislation Act 2003* authorises First Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial and presentational changes to a compiled law in preparing a compilation of the law for registration. The changes must not change the effect of the law. Editorial changes take effect from the compilation registration date.

If the compilation includes editorial changes, the endnotes include a brief outline of the changes in general terms. Full details of any changes can be obtained from the Office of Parliamentary Counsel.

#### Misdescribed amendments

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A misdescribed amendment is an amendment that does not accurately describe the amendment to be made. If, despite the misdescription, the amendment can be given effect as intended, the amendment is incorporated into the compiled law and the abbreviation "(md)" added to the details of the amendment included in the amendment history.

If a misdescribed amendment cannot be given effect as intended, the abbreviation "(md not incorp)" is added to the details of the amendment included in the amendment history.
