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## 1 Name

This instrument is the *Industry Research and Development (Eat Seafood Australia Program) Instrument 2020*.

## 2 Commencement

## 3 Authority

This instrument is made under section 33 of the *Industry Research and Development Act 1986*.

## 4 Definitions

In this instrument:

*Act* means the *Industry Research and Development Act 1986*.

*program*: see subsection 5(1).

## 5 Prescribed program

- (1) For the purposes of subsection 33(1) of the Act, the Eat Seafood Australia Program (the *program*) is prescribed.
- (2) The program provides funding in the form of a grant to Seafood Industry Australia Limited to deliver a 12-month national marketing campaign that encourages domestic consumption of Australian seafood.
- (3) The purpose of the program is to stimulate a boost in domestic demand for Australian seafood in order to:
- support the seafood industry's survival through the national crisis resulting from the coronavirus known as COVID-19; and
  - bolster a strong, industry-wide recovery as markets normalise.

## **6 Specified legislative power**

For the purposes of subsection 33(3) of the Act, the powers of the Parliament to make laws with respect to the following are specified:

- (a) postal, telegraphic, telephonic, and other like services (within the meaning of paragraph 51(v) of the Constitution);
- (b) enterprises and activities that are peculiarly adapted to the government of a nation and cannot otherwise be carried on for the benefit of the nation.
