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## 1 Name

This instrument is the *Financial Framework (Supplementary Powers) Amendment (Health Measures No. 7) Regulations 2021*.

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## Schedule 1—Amendments

### *Financial Framework (Supplementary Powers) Regulations 1997*

#### **1 Part 4 of Schedule 1AB (table item 179, column headed “Objective(s)”, paragraph (i))**

Repeal the paragraph, substitute:

- (i) supporting research relating to drug and alcohol misuse; and
- (j) supporting capital works for infrastructure (including upgrading existing infrastructure) to provide treatment and support services for drug and alcohol misuse.
