#### 1 Name

This is the Amendment Statement of Principles concerning sensorineural hearing loss (Balance of Probabilities) (No. 76 of 2025).

#### 2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 22 September 2025.

#### 3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsections 196B(3) and (8) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*.

#### 4 Amendment

The Statement of Principles concerning *sensorineural hearing loss (Balance of Probabilities)* (No. 99 of 2019) (Federal Register of Legislation No. F2019L01361) is amended in the following manner:

Section	Amendment
7(2)	Replace the existing subsection 7(2) with the following:
	<ul> <li>(a) means acquired hearing loss due to a defect in the cochlea or auditory nerve, with a permanent shift to a hearing threshold level of 20 decibels (dB) or more, at 500, 1 000, 1 500, 2 000, 3 000, 4 000 or 6 000 hertz (Hz); and</li> <li>(b) excludes:</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>(i) congenital deafness; and</li><li>(ii) hearing loss due to Meniere disease and</li><li>Meniere syndrome.</li></ul>
	Note: The diagnosis of sensorineural hearing loss is usually made by performing an audiogram in which bone conduction thresholds are measured.
