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1 Name

This instrument is the *List of Exempt Native Specimens Amendment (South Australian Rock Lobster Fishery) Instrument, September 2025*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after it is registered.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsection 303DC(1)(a) of the EPBC Act.

4 Definitions

In this instrument:

EPBC Act means the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.
