THE PARLIAMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

A BILL

To grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of One million ten thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds to the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and two.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty the Senate Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives as follows :—

- 5 1. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and application of £1,010,732. making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and two the sum of One million ten thousand seven hundred and thirty-two pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue
- 10 Fund, for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.
2. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under Sum available for the purposes set forth in Schedule. the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and
