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## A Bill for an Act to amend the *Customs Act 1901*, and for related purposes

The Parliament of Australia enacts:

#### 4 1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the *Customs Amendment (New Zealand Rules of Origin) Act 2011.* 

#### 2 Commencement

(1) Each provision of this Act specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.
