Sydney, 27th February, 1901.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has been pleased to approve of all persons in the employ of any State which has become a part of the Commonwealth, who, on 31st December, 1900, were authorised under the provisions of the Audit Act of that State to—

- (a) Collect the Customs and Excise Revenue of the State ;
- (b) Pay such Revenue into the Public Account of the State ;
- (c) Draw moneys from the said Public Account for the payment of drawbacks and refunds or for the maintenance of the Department of Customs and Excise,

being appointed during the pleasure of His Excellency the Governor-General-in-Council to, as the case may be,

- (a) Collect the Customs and Excise Revenue of the Commonwealth ;
- (b) Pay such Revenue into the Commonwealth Consolidated Revenue Account ;
- (c) Draw moneys from the last-mentioned Account, in pursuance of warrants granted by the Governor-General.

The Governor-General-in-Council also directs that, should any of the abovementioned officers be superseded on or after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one, their lawfully appointed successors shall have authority to act in like manner.

The Governor-General-in-Council further directs that in each State the Permanent Head of the Treasury Department and the Auditor-General or Commissioners of Audit, as the case may be, shall be appointed Commonwealth Officers during the pleasure of His Excellency the Governor-General-in-Council.
