PROCLAMATION

Australia
to wit.
HOPETOUN.
L.S.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable the Earl of Hopetoun, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Customs Act 1901* it is enacted that this Act shall commence on a day to be fixed by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, the Governor-General aforesaid, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby fix Friday, the fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and one, as the day on which the said Act shall commence.

Given at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, this third day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.
