## PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia By His Excellency the Right Honorable Henry Stafford, BARON NORTHCOTE,  
to wit. Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael  
and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of the Most Eminent  
· NORTHCOTE, Order of the Indian Empire, Companion of the Most Honorable  
Governor-General. Order of the Bath, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the  
Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor-General might appoint such times for holding the Sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit, and also from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, prorogue the Parliament: Now therefore I, the said Henry Stafford, Baron Northcote, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Constitution, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Parliament until the fifteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eight.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, at Sydney, this eleventh day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.
